

Swine in the Pines Prospect Show
2018 General Rules

New rules and procedures are bolded.

1. Show is open to all youth from any state under the age of 21 years old as of January 1, 2018.
2. If the show is canceled because of a major weather event (hurricane etc), the Swine committee will attempt to reschedule a replacement date as close to August 25th, 2018, as possible. An attempt will be made to notify exhibitors via email and will be reflected on our Facebook page.
3. No limit to the number of animals you can show.
4. Swine will be judged on current and future potential market characteristics.
5. All animals must be checked and weight cards turned in prior to 9am Saturday, August 25th. **Pens will be assigned in the order that completed applications are received.**
6. Pigs may be penned 2 pigs per pen if needed. Placement of hogs will be coordinated by an event volunteer. Bring a divider if you need one. This year we have added additional (larger) pens to accommodate pigs. These pens should hold 2 large hogs (up to 300 lbs each). Please indicate on the application if you need a larger pen. These pens will be utilized to pen larger hogs first.
7. All swine are required to have health papers. All out of state swine must also have a Florida permit number on the health papers in order to enter Florida. Permit number can be obtained by your veterinarian by contacting Doyle Conner at (850) 410-0956. All health papers must be issued within 30 days of August 25, 2018. Pigs with an obvious health issue may be refused entry in the show.
8. Barrows and gilts only, NO Boars will be allowed.
9. All hogs should have a readable ear tag.
10. Pen space is limited, showing off trailer is encouraged as parking spaces allow. Trailer parking is on a first come, first served basis. Event volunteers will assist in locating trailers in designated areas to maximize the use of parking area. Generators are encouraged as electrical outlets are limited.
11. Space will be available for minimal washing and grooming.
12. Sponsors reserve the right to close the registration period prior to the deadline if necessary.
13. Classes will be split based on weight (approx 10-15 per class). **Divisions will be comprised of 3-5 classes at the sponsors' discretion.**
14. The judge's decisions are final in all classes.
15. Any youth under the age of 21 as of January 1, 2018, is permitted to show in showmanship if an exhibitor will allow you to use his or her pig.
16. Showmanship ages will follow NJSA rules and guidelines.
17. Show officials reserve the right to make changes deemed to be in the best interest of the show.
18. **In an effort to start the show on time, showmanship entries will not be accepted after 5pm on August 24, 2018. No day-of-show showmanship entries will be accepted.**
19. Showmanship money will be split as follows...1st-50%, 2nd-25%, 3rd-15%, 4th-7%, and 5th-3% of all entry money received for that age group.
20. Based on a minimum of 100 entries, payout will be
 - Grand Champion: \$1,000
 - Reserve Champion: \$500
 - Third Overall: \$300
 - Fourth Overall: \$200
 - Fifth Overall: \$100
21. If less than 100 entries, payout will be
 - Grand Champion: \$500
 - Reserve Champion: \$250
 - Third Overall: \$150
 - Fourth Overall: \$100
 - Fifth Overall: \$50
22. Weather permitting, all animals must be removed 2 hours following conclusion of the show.
23. All entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor and a parent or legal guardian.
24. Entry forms must be signed and received with entry fee to be accepted.
25. All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning pens prior to leaving barns.

26. Shavings will be sold the day of the show or you may bring your own.
27. The show committee, Baker County Farm Bureau, Baker County FFA Alumni, nor the Baker County Fairgrounds will be responsible for any accidents or injuries that occur.

Directions—

Entering From Georgia on SR 121, Turn right CR23B (the first red light you encounter, not caution light, after entering Florida, which is about 5 miles once you cross the Florida state line). Go ¼ mile and turn right on Tom Wilkerson Road, follow around until you see the fairgrounds.

From I-10 Westbound, take exit 336 (State Rd 228) and go north. Continue through Macclenny until the 3rd red light State Road 228 becomes CR23B. Continue through the 3rd red light on CR23B ¼ mile and turn right on Tom Wilkerson Road, follow around until you see the fairgrounds.

From I-10 Eastbound, take exit 335 (State Rd 121) and go north. Continue through downtown Macclenny until the 5th red light. Turn left on CR23B (the 5th light you encounter from the interstate) and proceed ¼ mile and turn right on Tom Wilkerson Road, follow around until you see the fairgrounds.

Lodging arrangements: Travel Lodge located at State Road 121 and I-10 (preferred vendor) Others are also located the same intersection.
